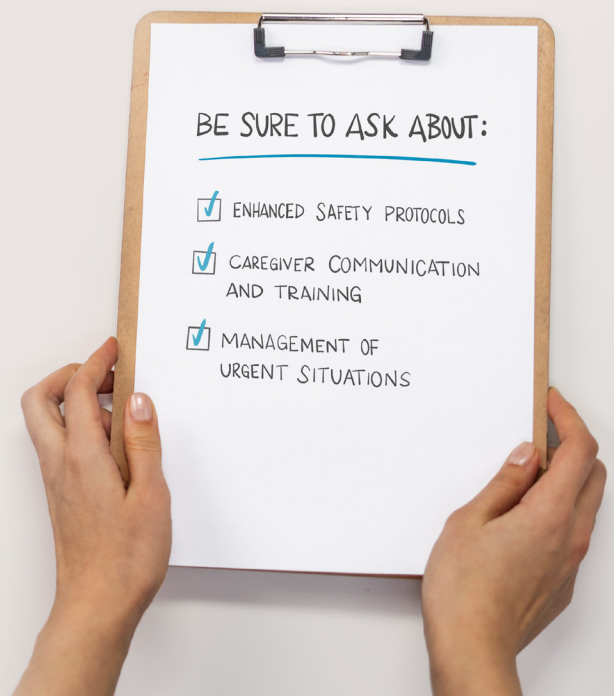


Your Infection Mitigation Safety Checklist

Know What to Ask Before Setting Up Care

Many families are balancing the risks of non-family members coming into their homes and the benefits of trained caregivers supporting their loved one's critical needs. While home is the safest place for your loved one, not all home care agencies are created equal. Be sure you're working with an agency that prioritizes the health and well-being of your family and your caregivers—and has systems and protocols in place to support your safety.

10 Questions to Ask Before Choosing a Home Care Agency

Enhanced Safety Protocols

- ✓ What are your updated safety protocols and how are they documented?
- ✓ What are your call-off and sick leave policies for caregivers with infectious symptoms?
- ✓ When do you require personal protective equipment (PPE), such as gloves and masks, and how do you help your clients acquire hard-to-find items?

Caregiver Communication and Training

- ✓ What training do you provide your caregivers to support proper infection control?
- ✓ How often do you update your caregiver protocols and how do you communicate these updates to them?
- ✓ How do you ensure that caregivers comply with your safety protocols?

Management of Urgent Situations

- ✓ Do you offer 24/7 trained support for urgent situations?
- ✓ If a caregiver is suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19, what would you do?
- ✓ If a client is suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19, what would you do?
- ✓ If my caregiver has to cancel at the last minute, how would you restaff the visit?

A responsible home care agency that prioritizes your safety during this crisis will have clear and complete answers to each of these questions. We hope this is helpful to you and your family.
